We are a non-denominational and co-educational learning space. This richness and diversity of perspectives fosters an environment of inclusiveness, patience and collaboration.




AN EDUCATION FOR LIFE BEYOND SCHOOL

Teaching and learning at the International School of Western Australia follows the globally recognised International Baccalaureate programmes.

The International Baccalaureate programmes aim to develop inquiring, knowledgeable and caring young people who help to create a better and more peaceful world through intercultural understanding and respect.

Our Programmes

Middle Years Programme (MYP) Years 7 to Year 10



Diploma Programme (DP) Years 11 and Year 12



Student Wellbeing

ISWA students require every element of their wellbeing to flourish, in order to be happy and healthy. Dimensions such as social, physical and emotional wellbeing are equally important to allow students to connect meaningfully and safely in their relationships, feel a sense of community and succeed at school.

We are guided by the Australian Human Rights Commission, the National Principles for Child Safe Organisations and



The United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child. We are acredited partners of the Visible Wellbeing programme and our teachers are also trained in implementing the Keeping Safe Curriculum, which covers four main strands targeted to each specific year level. They are The Right to Be Safe, Relationships, Recognising and Reporting Abuse and lastly Protective Strategies. In Secondary School, these lessons are explored within Homeroom Periods and through some of the subject Curriculum.



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
